





For a fourth consecutive year, the music department at St Canice's Cathedral, Kilkenny will host a series of Sunday afternoon concerts in June. This year's series starts on June 7th with an exciting combined performance by the cathedral choirs of St. Canice's Kilkenny, Christ Church Waterford and St. Mary's Limerick. ... The programme includes the combined choirs in a performance of Schubert's Mass in G, conducted by St Canice's choral director David Forde and accompanied by cathedral organist, Malcolm Proud. Eric Sweeney will conduct the choir of Christ Church Cathedral Waterford in his own Mass of St. Patrick, accompanied by organist Cecilia Keogh. Peter Barley will conduct the choir of St. Mary's Cathedral Limerick in music by Byrd and other composers. St. Canice's Cathedral choir will perform a range of choral works, and will also be conducted and accompanied by cathedral organ scholar Róisín Rowley-Brooke. All three choirs will combine for a performance of Parry's famous choral masterpiece I was glad. With over 60 voices, the Three Choirs' Concert at 4pm on 7th June event promises to be a most memorable event.

The concert series will continue on each Sunday throughout June, with chamber music concerts in the intimate surroundings of the cathedral chapter room. Sunday 14th sees Kilkenny-based recorder player

Laoise O'Brien and guitarist Michael O'Toole returning having performed to great acclaim in the 2014 series. Soprano Roisin O'Grady will sing Purcell and Schubert on Sunday 21st, accompanied by Malcolm Proud. The final concert will take place on Sunday 28th June with violinist Marja Gaynor, cellist Aoife Nic Athlaoich and harpsichordist Malcolm Proud. The concerts are at 4pm, tickets are €15 (€10), and available at the door or in advance from the cathedral on (056) 776 4971. Refreshments are available after the concerts, with an opportunity to meet and chat with the artists.



Joe Hill Songwriting Competition - Thomastown

The George Brown Memorial Committee is pleased to announce their first ever songwriting competition. 2015 marks the 100th anniversary of the execution of Joe Hill in Utah, USA. Joe was a workers activist and member of the Industrial Workers of the World. His execution was controversial and is considered to be a miscarriage of justice resulting from his trade union activities.

Joe Hill will be a central theme of the 2015 George Brown Commemoration, with a key-note speech on his story and subsequent influence on the worker's movement. We are also offering a prize of €150 for the best submission in our songwriting competition, where we are asking for words to two new verses for the song Joe Hill. These verses should deal with the difficulties experienced by workers since 1915 and/or the advances achieved over the subsequent century. Vultures – A New Radio Series

The new radio serial from Devious Theatre has gone online in its entirety. *Vultures* is a 20 part murder mystery serial originally broadcast on KCLR96FM last month.



Vultures focuses on the private detectives of Vulture Private Investigations, a small time detective agency in south east Ireland. **Janine Drew, Dan McGrain, Jim Vultour** and **Niall Tennyson** are the detectives in question and the story follows them as they get caught up in a suspenseful murder mystery at the Detective Union Of Ireland AGM. The show follows the varying perspectives of the four bungling sleuths as they trawl the corridors of Wisteria Lodge, searching for a killer, quizzing a colourful cast of suspects and trying to figure out who killed Ireland's most famous detective Basil Maguire? And why?



the public's experience of architecture. The Engaging with Architecture Scheme also seeks to build an expert network of architects, curators, arts programmers,

Twice yearly, the Arts Council offers grants to enable artists and communities of place/or interest to work together on projects. The Artist in the Community Scheme is managed by Create, the national development agency for collaborative arts.

The scheme is open to artists from any of the following artform disciplines: architecture, circus, street art and spectacle, dance, film, literature (Irish and English language), music, opera, theatre, visual arts and traditional arts. The projects can take place in a diverse range of social and community contexts eg arts and health; arts in prisons; arts and older people; arts and cultural diversity.

The aim of the scheme is to encourage meaningful collaboration between communities of place and/or interest and artists. It is essential that consultation take place between the artist and the community group, so that both parties are involved in deciding on the nature of the project realisation. Group ownership of the art should be maintained at every stage. The Project Realisation may result in a variety of outcomes.

There are two phases to the scheme. Phase One <u>Research & Development</u>, is open to artists who wish to research and develop a project in a community context.

There is also a <u>Research & Development/Mentoring</u> strand, open to artists who wish to develop a community based project and who have identified an artist mentor they want to work with during the research and development phase.

Phase Two <u>Project Realisation</u>, is open to communities of interest or place (or their representative organisations) with an artist.

Coming Soon: Movie-style trailers for all the arts

In our digital world, video has become a powerful way to promote upcoming arts events, and many people would rather watch a movie-style trailer or a short news report than read an article or a brochure.

Although some arts organisations in Ireland, are already making these sort of promotional /news videos, and would like them to be viewed by as many people as possible, we don't have a central structure for distributing them.

The Arts Council would like to create such a structure, to help generate more videos, ensure they are in a unifying format, distribute them in as many additional ways as possible (eg. social media, Culturefox, YouTube, Vimeo), and package some as 'arts magazine' programmes for broadcast.

Our ambition is that within a year, most arts organisations will be making and editing their own trailers or news pieces about upcoming concerts, plays, gigs, performances, exhibitions -- and encouraging people to attend.

This is an exciting prospect -- imagine, for example, if for every work that goes on tour you could see a short interview with the artist, the director, the curator to whet your appetite before it reached your local venue!

We've engaged the Institute of Local Television for this project; its team members have considerable experience of this from Scotland, they take a very practical approach and are focused on getting things done.

To that end they will be engaging with arts organisations across the country in the months ahead, making videos, training/mentoring and helping arts organisations to make and edit their own, assisting with promotion, building a central structure.
