

'Ambushed by irresistible poetry from 13 different directions'

Kilkenny's Arts Officer, Mary Butler and those involved in bringing out Kilkenny Poetry Broadsheet No 14 staged a coup at the Parade Tower of Kilkenny Castle on Friday evening by getting American poet laureate and one of the world's best selling writers, Billy Collins to launch the impressive collection of poems.

He was witty, engaging and spoke of the need to get poetry out of the classroom and into public places and said the broadsheet was a perfect way to do this. He regaled the audience which included Kilkenny's Minister for Rural Affairs, Ann Phelan, by saying he agreed with inserting poetry on the back of cereal boxes.

"People have a resistance to poetry, so give them no time to resist it - Ambush them with poetry so they don't have time to deploy their anti-poetry deflector shields," he said before unashamedly, reciting some of his own work which was an absolute treat.

This latest instalment of the broadsheet is hugely impressive and it is the last poem on the broadsheet that caught my eye first, composed by actor, Rachael Hanaphy-Pigott:

Apple of his eye
I fell for him
To the dirt
Of disappointment.

Every piece in this A3 piece of paper is strong, worthy of inclusion and worth investigating.

Established poet Gerry Moran returns to one of his favourite themes in the 14th installment of the broadsheet - The bond between father and son. "Burying The Cat" is superb and personal.

The farmer's son from Inistioge, Larry Cotter's nine liner, Who I Am, is a gem and is now posted on my fridge. Reading it is a good way to start off the day.

Another beautiful piece comes from the hand of Nuala Roche and already being a fan of her earlier work, her take on Steve McQueen's role in the Great Escape is fascinating and unexpected.

The Last Walk by Noel Howley is sombre and a familiar story.

Michael Massey is one of our finest writers and his piece, A Lot Can Happen Between The Bridges allows you to travel with him on his nature trail.

To Mary Butler, Niamh Brophy and Julianne Morgan, well done.

As always design is excellent by Atticus with a thoughtful illustration by Ale Meecado.

Editor, Enda Coyle-Greene did a great job.

"Generations Exploring Heritage Together" Heritage Week 23rd - 31st August

The theme of this year's Heritage Week which runs from Saturday 23rd – Sun 31st August is "Generations Exploring Heritage Together".

Why not bring the kids to see the acclaimed film "Project Wild Thing" – a feature length documentary film about reconnecting children with nature. According to the Guardian newspaper, "Funny, alarming and uplifting. This film will change your life".

There's a chance for kids to "sow and grow" at Jerpoint Abbey, hunt for mini-beasts in Woodstock Gardens, dig for medieval archaeology in Rothe House, become an art detective in Kilkenny Castle, and explore Kilkenny's newest Pop Up Museum at the Parade.

Local heritage groups have compiled a fabulous programme of events. There's a rare chance to see a traditional lime kiln in operation. The kiln, last used in the 1930's, is being brought back to life especially for Heritage Week. Why not take a guided walk through Inistioge, Kells, Mount Juliet and Tullahought; explore Freshford's forgotten history; hear the stories and see the exhibitions of old fieldnames, folklore and past lives in Lisdowney, Castlecomer, Goresbridge and Ferrybank; hike the heights of Brandon Hill; and trace the steps of the famine victims in Callan and Newmarket.

And not forgetting past generations, our military heritage is also very well represented in the programme, and includes guided walks and talks about the contribution that Kilkenny men and woman made to both World War 1 and the War of Independence.

According to Dearbhala Ledwidge, Heritage Officer, "This is the most diverse and comprehensive Heritage Week programme to date. It's a great opportunity for people to experience and enjoy the wonderful heritage we have on our doorstep in County Kilkenny".

These photographs were mostly taken on the streets of Dublin 2002 - 2007. Javier Iglesias Ramos joined groups of people living on the streets at various intervals. He explored a particular view of life and photographed his experiences. A premonitory and instinctive account of a society in crises is what he managed to capture before the actual fall of The Celtic Tiger.

"The Celtic Tiger has vanished out of sight whilst street people still remain", Javier Iglesias Ramos (June 2014).

Javier was born in A Baña, Galicia, Spain in 1965. He studied Art Photography at the Escola de Artes Maestro Mateo, (Santiago de Compostela, Galicia, Spain) and completed his training by way of multiple workshops, courses and seminars with renowned photographers such as Alberto García Álix, Stuart Franklin, Cristina García Rodero, Chris Steele Perkins, Ricky Davila, Hunberto Rivas, Luís de Las Alas. The core of his work is social photography, addressing topics such as drug addiction on the streets of Santiago de Compostela, poverty in Quito (Ecuador), ecological disaster of the Prestige in Galicia, misery and desolation in the refugee camps of Tinduf (Algeria).

Between 2002 and 2007 Javier carried out this current work on the streets of Dublin. At various intervals, he joined a group of people living on the margins and photographed the atmosphere presented to him. This show is coming to Kilkenny after being very well received at the Galway Fringe Festival in July, where it was exhibited in Áras na nGael.

This is the artists' first time to show in Kilkenny, so we hope you will join us to extend a warm welcome to his work on Friday August 8th at 5pm at the Upstairs Gallery, Watergate Theatre, Parliament Street Kilkenny.




