ROADS

NON-NATIONAL ROADS

Kilkenny County Council received an allocation of \notin 14,948,195 for works on Non-National roads for 2020. The funding announced covers a wide variety of works and is an increase of almost \notin 2 million on 2019's allocation.

Some of the works covered by the allocation are

- Restoration Improvement €7.8m,
- Surface dressing €2.2m,
- 17 no safety schemes costing €368k,
- 11 no bridge upgrades at a cost of 200k
- Drainage and Discretionary works totalling €3.3m covering local upgrades to footpath, local drainage issues etc.
- Increase in funding for the CIR scheme from €494k to almost €640k which covers Local Tertiary roads.

Each Municipal District will now prepare their local road works scheme which will form part of the 2020 road works scheme for Kilkenny.

OTHER PROJECTS:

Kilkenny Western Environs Phase 1 Infrastructure

Construction of the scheme commenced on 4th March. Works are progressing well and are on programme to finish by the planned completion date of September 2020. The Circular Road is currently closed to facilitate construction of a new bridge over the River Breagagh. These works are expected to be completed in March 2020, allowing the Circular Road to reopen.

Castlecomer Pedestrian Bridge

Kilkenny County Council applied for planning permission to An Bord Pleanala for the Castlecomer Pedestrian Bridge on the 9th August 2019. The oral hearing took place on the 30th January 2020. Kilkenny County Council is waiting the outcome of the hearing which will take a number of weeks.

FORWARD PLANNING

Regional Spatial and Economic Strategy

The Regional Spatial and Economic Strategy (RSES) became operable from the 31st January 2020. This plan will now be used to guide the review of the Kilkenny City and County Development Plan.

City & County Development Plan:

The Review of the Kilkenny City and County Development is required by law to recommence within 13 weeks from the adoption of the RSES (i.e. 31st of January, 2020), and a target date for recommencement has been set for 30th of March 2020. Work on various plans and strategies required for the new plan continues to progress. Masterplans have also commenced for the Loughmacask, Fairgreen and St. Canice's hospital areas of the City. A public consultation meeting for the pre-draft stage of the Loughmacask Masterplan took place on the 20th of January 2020 and was attended by over 60 people. The closing date for submissions is the 12th of February 2020.

Work on the retail strategy, housing needs demands assessment, renewable energy strategy, Strategic Environmental Assessment,

Appropriate Assessment and other constituents of the new City and County Development Plan continues in the background.

Graiguenamanagh Local Area Plan

The joint Local Area Plan for Graiguenamanagh and Tinnahinch continues. The period for public submissions to the issues paper has closed and the preparation of a report on the pre-draft consultation is nearing completion. It is anticipated that a draft plan will be published in March 2020 following consultation with the Thomastown Municipal District and Carlow County Council.

Vacant sites

A total of 17 sites were added to the Register for 2020. Notices were issued to the relevant landowners in late December, giving notice that sites are being included on the their Register. Three owners have appealed these entries to An Bord Pleanála. We are currently in the process of establishing the market value of these new sites. Following correspondence with Irish Water in relation to the feasibility of connecting to the water supply in Castlecomer, a decision was taken to cancel 5 sites in the Castlecomer area.

There are currently 38 sites on the Vacant Sites Register. A total of 21 of these are now liable for the 7% levy. Payment demands will issue for these 21 sites shortly. Two sites have had their levy discharged to date.

An Bord Pleanála recently made their two decisions in relation to the payment demands issued in January 2019, and upheld one payment demand and cancelled the other.

The number of cancelled entries due to site activation or improvement now stands at 11 sites.

CONSERVATION

Conservation Grants

All conservation grants are currently being assessed. All applicants will be notified of the status of their application as soon as the

Department of Culture, Heritage, and Gaeltacht comments on projects forwarded by Kilkenny County Council. The following number of applications have been received:

A Heritage Council Historic Towns Initiative 2020 application was submitted on the 7th February last for works to St. Mary's Church railings, and, the Abbey Footbridge, in Callan. Both projects adhere to the required heritage lead regeneration aspect of the Initiative.

Tender documents have been received for architectural heritage refurbishment works in Inistioge Square and Poyntz Lane in Inistioge.

Taking in Charge

Work continues on 4 no. estates where the Taking In Charge (TIC) process was initiated in 2019 and it is anticipated that the TIC process will be concluded on these sites in Q1 2020:

Tenders for required TIC works were concluded for 2 no. estates towards the end of 2019 and the initiation stage of the TIC process will commence on these in Q1 2020 upon completion of works:

- Banagher Court Piltown; and
- The Green, Ballyfoyle.

Tidy Town Groups that engage with the Tidy Towns Forum have been encouraged to submit their views regarding the introduction of a Deposit-Refund Scheme for plastic bottles and drink cans to assist in curbing the volumes of roadside litter.

Inistioge Nominated for Ireland's Best Kept **Towns Competition**

The Department of Communications, Climate Action and Environment has nominated Inistige to participate in Ireland's Best Kept Towns Competition under the Best Kept Village Award. This competition is an all island initiative organized jointly by the Department and the Northern Ireland Amenity Council. Judging takes place in May and the results will be announced in June.

Educational Visits

1st to 4th year classes in Callan CBS were provided with an environmental talk (23rd January) to complement their current environmental programme to improve waste segregation in their school. At the end of each session, the students were asked to be responsible citizens and to pick up after their dogs and assist Callan in becoming litter free to support the local tidy towns group.



Other school visits completed in January included Scoil San Nioclás, Windgap & St. Senans NS Scheduled February school visits Kilmacow. include Clogh NS, Clara NS & St Johns Junior

School and an environmental talk is scheduled for the Adult Learning Service, Kilkenny City.

ENVIRONMENTAL GRANTS SEEKING SUBMISSIONS

Anti-Litter Anti-Graffiti and Awareness **Community Grant**

Kilkenny County Council is offering community groups an opportunity this year to promote antilitter and anti-graffiti awareness in their local community. The grant is to mobilise community groups to care for their local environment by decreasing the impact of litter by its removal and to promote a social message locally to encourage everyone to put litter in its rightful place - in a bin. The closing date for grant applications is the 13th of March and applications are available on the grant portal of www.kilkennycoco.ie or direct from the Environment Section in County Hall.

Waste Prevention Grant Scheme 2020

Kilkenny County Council is offering community groups an opportunity this year to promote waste prevention, creating an opportunity to look at waste differently and to determine if we can handle our resources better, to contribute to a zero waste society and encourage a circular economy. Preference will be given to projects that contribute to a zero waste lifestyle which by means of education, craft or innovation. The closing date for grant applications is the 13th of March and applications are available on the grant portal of www.kilkennycoco.ie or direct from the Environment Section in County Hall.

Update on Bikes to Africa Project

In January a delegation from Rotary Ireland, along with an Environment Section official, met with the Department of Communications, Climate Action & Environment with a view to exploring the possibility of getting government funding to sustain and develop the Bikes to Africa Project across other Local Authorities within the country.

The response was positive from the Department that they would back Rotary Ireland in its efforts

to roll out the Kilkenny Bikes for Africa Model across the 14 largest towns in Ireland.

The Kilkenny Rotary Club noted this would not have happened if it were not for the support and collaboration of the Environment Section of Kilkenny County Council.

This is a major result for Rotary Ireland and it will mean that nationally they, in conjunction with other stakeholders, should be able to significantly multiply the impact of this great project into the future.

CRM: Customer Relations Management System In 2019 the Environment Section received 1066 complaints from members of the public. These complaints related to 688 litter, 216 illegal dumping 42 water/waste water, 62 air, 9 noise and 45 dead animals and 4 misc. Of the 1,066 complaints received 1,014 no. were investigated and the appropriate action taken, the remaining 52 are still under investigation.

Ballyragget Historic Landfill Remediation Contract

The Ballyragget Historic Landfill site is approximately 6 acres and is located 1.5km southeast of Ballyragget town at Donaghmore. Works are currently 90% complete on the €1.4million Ballyragget Historic Landfill Remediation Contract. The works progressed to date includes, re-profiling of the existing landfill cap, provision of LLDPE liner, installation of a gas collection / venting system and the installation of perimeter drainage. Currently sub-soiling work is being progressed on-site as shown in the photograph. The project is scheduled for completion in March/April 2020, subject to favourable weather conditions for the completion of sub-soiling, topsoiling and landscaping work. It is anticipated that the remediation contract will come in on budget.



Christmas Tree Recycling

Approximately 10 tonnes of Christmas Trees were collected from free drop off locations around the county and brought to the Dunmore Recycling & Waste Disposal Centre for chipping:

Graiguenamanagh:	0.6 tonnes
Thomastown:	5.7 tonnes
Callan:	<mark>0.5 tonn</mark> es
Urlingford & Freshford:	1.2 tonnes
Ballyragget & Castlecomer:	1 tonne
Dunmore:	8 tonnes

Another 8 tonnes approximately was delivered directly to Dunmore by the public. All trees were chipped on site at Dunmore with intention that the end product will be used for public amenity trails and walking routes.

PARKS

South East Greenway

Works have commenced on some of the enabling contracts on the South East Greenway which runs from Ferrybank in Waterford to New Ross, terminating at Mount Elliot. The route covers a distance of 24km in total mainly through rural south Kilkenny.

To enable the detail designs to be completed for the project the track has been cleared of scrub vegetation allowing access for the first time in years. Detail site surveys have carried out along with bore hole investigations at sites where underpasses may be required for certain farming operations. In tandem with these works a team from Wexford and Kilkenny County Council are meeting with landowners along the route to discuss accommodation works.

Upon completion of this phase of works, the detail design can be completed and the tender documents finalised. Contract documents must then be sent to the Department of Tourism Transport and Sport for approval following which the project will go to Public Tender for the construction phase. It is anticipated works will commence on site in September 2020 with a completion date being set at December 2021.

Woodstock Gardens

Works are currently underway to upgrade paths damaged by heavy winter rain and to improve the surface where trees have fallen during recent storms. The stormy weather this winter has resulted in losses of some trees of significance. The age profile of the planting means the tree collection is more susceptible to winds and storms into the future presenting a need to constantly renew the tree collection to ensure there will always be a stock of young trees developing for future years. Trees of significance in the gardens have now been marked with a special plaque informing visitors of the origin of the tree and the significance of the species globally.



An application for funding has been made to the Department of Rural and Community Development to continue trail development in the wider estate through the woodland walks. If successful, this grant will fund the development of the walks as far as the little known Brownsford Stream Waterfall at the Red House. More funding of \in 17,634 has been awarded under the same ORIS grant scheme to prepare a

communications and marketing strategy for Woodstock gardens in 2020. Woodstock now has over 5,000 followers on Facebook. Staff from Kilkenny Civic Trust will assist in running a social media campaign to build further on this and promote Woodstock on line.

Funding of €14,000 was received from the Sports Capital Grant through the Department of Tourism, Transport and Sport for the development of an outdoor exercise trail adjacent to the natural playground in Woodstock. Quotations have now been received for this and work will commence on site shortly.

Ferrybank Neighbourhood Park

Work is well advanced on the construction of the Ferrybank Neighbourhood Park. The path network is now in place along with the terraced area for the seating area and climbing wall being constructed currently. The playground equipment is currently being added with the facility expected to be open for Easter 2020.

The park is being jointly funded by the Department of Housing, Planning, and Local Government (50%), Kilkenny County Council (25%), and Waterford City and County Council (25%). The project represents a practical manifestation of the two Local Authorities in the area working together for the benefit of Ferrybank, and the wider Waterford City area.

The construction of the park will create a much needed central amenity facility for Ferrybank, incorporating a children's playground, walking route, teenager meeting point, and playing pitch.

Tree Planting

The Parks Section has completed its programme of tree planting in the city and county commemorating а number of special anniversaries. The planting programme is the beginning of our commitment to increase tree planting county wide to assist in addressing Climate Change. The trees are all native and or pollinator friendly and were semi mature in size at planting. Sadly, some of the trees planted in Lintown Hall have been broken by persons unknown. These will be re-planted immediately in an effort to reinstate the avenue of trees which once stood here.

Amenity Grants

Over 163 groups received grant assistance under the Amenity Grant Scheme in 2019 amounting to

a total of €127k in funding. All applicants who submitted their claims in 2019 have been paid their grant now. The Parks Department administers the amenity grants scheme, which is available to voluntary community organisations from all over the County.

The main objective of the scheme is to encourage and aid small-scale works to improve the local environment and encourage community involvement in the upkeep and maintenance of public amenities. The range of works funded includes landscaping, grass and meadow maintenance and development of open spaces, the provision of street and outdoor furniture and small-scale improvement works. In 2020 there will be more of an emphasis on supporting pollinators through projects which are funded.

Community groups will be encouraged to manage amenities in a more sustainable manner. An increase in the total budget of €13k will bring the total fund up to €140k for 2020. This increase in funding will further assist community groups in towns and villages maintain and upkeep their local neighbourhoods.

TOURISM

Festival Grants for 2020

Kilkenny County Council approved Tourism Festival grants in the sum of €89,000 for 2020 at the January Council Meeting.

The Festivals identified have or have potential to impact on Kilkenny's tourism industry, and in light of the Council's Climate Change commitments festivals will be encouraged to "green" their festivals and become local champions for our policie".

The Festival Grants were advertised in 2019, with a closing date of 13th December 2019.

The bank overdraft facility was not utilized during the month of January 2020. An application has been made to the Department of Housing Planning and Local Government for approval of a new term loan of €5m to provide funding for the capital programme. This loan will be drawn down immediately on receipt of approval from the Department.

The final out turn on cash collections for 2019 is not available yet. It is expected that the results will be in line with the previous year. The final figures will be available for the March Council meeting.

Following the revaluation of all commercial properties in Kilkenny in 2017 by the Valuation office, 196 property owners appealed their valuations to the Valuation Tribunal. The total value of the rate demand under appeal is ξ 4.5m representing 23% of the annual rate demand. A total of 133 appeals representing 47% of the rate demand appealed have been processed to date resulting in a reduction in annual rates income of almost ξ 522k. If this trend continues the estimated loss in annual rates income could exceed ξ 1.1m. Appeal decisions are backdated to the 1st of January 2018. It could take a number of months yet before all appeals are dealt with.
